What to Bring

Bible, notebook, pen, camera, sleeping bag, (or two twin sized sheets and a blanket) pillow, soap, and shampoo, comb/brush, towels, and washcloth, one extra large beach towel for swimming, toothbrush and toothpaste, flashlight, activity clothes, church clothes, one set of clothes you never want to wear again, dirty laundry bag, swimsuit, and personal Medications.

What not to bring

Radio, cds, or Mp3 players, electronic games, knives, guns, magazines, fireworks, matches, tobacco products, playing cards, and posters. Cell phone use will be allowed on a limited basis. A good rule of thumb... when it doubt, don't.

Attire

For evening services boys may wear long pants and collard shirts, girls may wear knee length or longer dresses or skirts with a nice top.

For daytime services or games boys may wear knee length shorts and t-shirts; girls may wear culottes, knee length basketball shorts and t-shirts. For tube time and swim time boys and girls may wear dark t-shirt and basketball shorts.

BMFP reserves the right at anytime to ask anyone to change for any reason .

Transportation

Students may arrive at camp by personal vehicle, church transportation, train, bus, or air.
